# JESUS PRAYED ALONE. JESUS PRAYED WITH FRIENDS.

Jesus had a rhythm to His prayer life. There were reflexive weekly and seasonal appointments with God and spur-of-the-moment prayer sessions anytime, anywhere. He often escaped the crowds to pray alone. And He also gathered friends and they prayed together. You get the sense that Jesus actually enjoyed prayer!

Twice a year our church family sets aside 21 days for a focused season of earnest, intentional prayer. We make time for those two simple types of prayer: We pray alone. We pray together. Each time we've done this we've seen remarkable things happen in the life of our church and in our very selves.

Marriages restored.

Financial crises averted.

Dreams rekindled.

Bodies healed.

Wounds forgiven.

Freedom found.

Unity embraced.

Joy remembered.

It's January 2022. In our history as a church, we've never encountered a season like the one we're in now. Anger, confusion, isolation, worry, sickness, anxiety, and depression are not just happening to the world around us; they're happening to us. We're facing the insidious enemies of division in our own church family.

The constant barrage of antagonistic voices in our culture have caused many of us to look with suspicion at people we've worshiped with, served with, given with, and believed with. Culture has demanded that we put everyone we know into the category of this social / political issue or that.

But Jesus said we'd be known for the remarkable love we show for one another, not only in spite of, but because of our differences. We can love one another because Jesus first loved us!

Now, more than ever, we need to get away with God and come together in prayer.

# WHAT YOU NEED

Pray alone. Pray with friends. Those are the two commitments we're asking you to make in this season. Here's what you need to prepare.

#### **HOW TO PRAY ALONE**

This prayer guide is going to walk you through key inflection points in Jesus prayer life. We'll watch Him and then try to do what He did. So here's all you need to do:

- » Join us for our daily prayer services at 6 AM, Monday through Friday.
- » On Saturdays, we'll have a time of worship and prayer at 9 AM.
- » Use this guide and your Bible daily.

# **HOW TO PRAY WITH FRIENDS**

There are two ways we're recommending you pray together with someone in this season.

#### 1. Partner up.

- » Invite a friend (or a couple of friends) to do this with you!
- » Commit to pray with and for one another every day for 21 days.
- » Have grace for yourself and one another!
- » If you miss a day or two, don't sweat it.
- » Be an encouragement to one another and pick back up anytime.

#### 2. Stay connected online.

- » Stay tuned to City Hope's social media platforms
- » Watch for daily reminders and weekly resources to help guide us through this season together
- » Don't have someone to partner with in prayer? Let us know online! We'd love to partner with you.

6 FASTING

# TEACH ME TO FAST

Jesus fasted and He encouraged His disciples to do so from time to time as well. Every year during this season, we commit to 21 days of fasting. Fasting isn't about punishment for sin. Jesus already took care of that for you. There are no rigid rules here. Fasting is about choosing to disconnect yourself from your dependence on the world.

Here are examples of the different types of fasts you might consider:

#### **COMPLETE FAST**

Talk to your doctor before you participate in this one, but it's just like it sounds. Complete or total fasting means you drink liquids only for all or a designated portion of our 21-Day Challenge (e.g. water or light juices).

#### SELECTIVE FAST

The majority of us will choose a selective fast. Scripture talks about this type of fast as choosing not to eat certain foods or drinks. The Daniel Fast is one example of a selective fast—no meats, sweets, or breads for 21 days. Whole 30, Vegan/plant-based, and Paleo meal plans are popular choices as well.

#### INTERMITTENT FAST

This was a common type of fast for the Hebrew people. For this fast, you designate certain times of the day for fasting. For example, no eating sun up to sundown or choosing to eat in the morning or afternoon only.

## **INPUT FAST**

This is also a very popular type of fast each year. An input fast can mean turning off social media, the news, television, movies, music, or turning off screens at certain times of the day altogether. The point of this type of fast is to guard the types of things that go into your mind and heart during this season.

"Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where He prayed." Mark 1v35 NIV

Notice: Jesus moved toward prayer.

# PREPARE.

GET AWAY WITH GOD.

Go to your solitary place for uninterrupted time with God.

- 1. Quiet your thoughts.
- 2. Rest your arms, hands palms up.
- 3. Take a deep breath.
- 4. Take another deep breath.
- 5. Relax your shoulders.

## FOCUS YOUR MIND.

Arrest your thoughts with your words. Repeat this prayer aloud from Ruth Haley Barton.

(Or use your private prayer language for a few moments.)

"As I enter prayer now, aware of my breath, I settle into this moment to be present with You. I acknowledge You're already here—closer to me than my very breath."

# LEARN.

Watch Jesus pray.

Read the full story of Jesus' prayer in Mark 1v35-42:

"And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, he departed and went out to a desolate place, and there he prayed.

And Simon and those who were with him searched for him, and they found him and said to him. "Everyone is looking for you."

And Jesus said to them, "Let us go on to the next towns, that I may preach there also, for that is why I came out."

And Jesus went throughout all Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out demons.

And a leper came to Jesus, imploring him, and kneeling said to him, "If you will, you can make me clean."

Moved with pity, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him and said to him, "I will; be clean." And immediately the leprosy left him, and he was made clean.

We don't know the words Jesus prayed here (He was alone with God, after all.).

# REFLECT.

We do see the reason Jesus prayed and what the outcome of His prayer was. Write what you observed after watching Jesus pray
PRAY.
Jesus moved toward God in prayer. God moved through Him. What was on Jesus' mind? Preaching in synagogues, casting out demons and healing an incurable disease. What's on your mind today? Anything bothering you? Anything you're looking forward to? Quickly jot down a word or two for each big idea behind what's ahead for you today and the near future. Then make a move toward God.

NOW START PRAYING!  Process your feelings; good, bad, or other; out loud, with God.  Tell Him what's on your mind.  Pray in English. Pray with your private prayer language.
Say more.
NOW STOP.
LISTEN.
This is where it gets good! Don't skip this part.
Ask: "God, is there anything You want to show me today?"
Take your time. Pick up your pen. Write down whatever He shows you.
If you didn't hear anything specific, that's okay. Write a "thank you note" to God here just for listening to your prayers.
KEEP ASKING.
Jesus said, "Keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for." Matthew 7v7 NLT
Ask again! "God, is there anything else?"
Pick up your pen. Write down whatever He shows you. End with gratitude.

"Jesus took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. As He was praying, the appearance of His face changed, and His clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning." Luke 9v28-29 NIV

- 5. Bow your head.

## FOCUS YOUR MIND.

Begin today with authentic surrender, by repeating the words of the honest prayer in Mark 9v24. Jesus calls: "all things are possible to one who believes". You respond:

"Lord Jesus, I do believe. Help me overcome my unbelief."

# LEARN.

Watch for what Jesus says about how not to pray in Matthew 6v5-9:

And when you come before God, don't turn that into a theatrical production. All these people making a regular show out of their prayers, hoping for stardom!

Do you think God sits in a box seat?

Here's what I want you to do: Find a quiet, secluded place so you won't be tempted to role-play before God.

Just be there as simply and honestly as you can manage. The focus will shift from you to God, and you will begin to sense his grace.

The world is full of so-called prayer warriors who are prayer-ignorant. They're full of formulas and programs and advice, peddling techniques for getting what you want from God. Don't fall for that nonsense.

This is your Father you are dealing with, and he knows better than you what you need. With a God like this loving you, you can pray very simply.

REFLECT.
What did you notice about how not to pray? How did Jesus tell us to pray instead' Write your answers and 3 other observations you made about what Jesus said.

Eugene Peterson writes,

"Our prayers, whether clumsy or skilled, heretical or orthodox, verbatim from Psalms or ad libbed from a sinking ship, get us no merit with God. God hears anything we whisper or shout, say or sing. Right words and correct forms are not prerequisite to a heavenly audience."

This means there's zero reason to be embarrassed to pray in front of other people.

### CONNECT.

You can do this! Reach out to your friend(s). Set up your time to chat.

- » Ask about their prayer time
- » Be ready to share yours
- » Pray for one another

#### REFLECT.

Jot down your friend's prayer requests and journal what you observed about this prayer time.

Notice: Jesus knew when to say no to the tyranny of the urgent.

# PREPARE.

GET AWAY WITH GOD.

Withdraw to your desolate place to be with God.

- 1. Quiet your thoughts.
- 2. Rest your arms, hands palms up.
- 3. Take a deep breath.
- 4. Take another deep breath.
- 5. Relax your shoulders.

#### FOCUS YOUR MIND.

Steer the rudder of your mind with your words. Repeat this prayer from **Psalm 3v6** aloud.

(Or use your private prayer language for a few moments.)

"I will not be afraid of many thousands of people who have set themselves against me all around."

# LEARN.

Watch what happens when Jesus breaks away to pray.

## Read Luke 5v15-17, 26:

Now even more the report about Jesus went abroad, and great crowds gathered to hear Him and to be healed of their infirmities.

As often as possible Jesus would withdraw to desolate places and pray.

On one of those days, as he was teaching, Pharisees and teachers of the law were sitting there, who had come from every village of Galilee and Judea and from Jerusalem.

And the power of the Lord was with Jesus to heal.

And amazement seized them all, and they glorified God and were filled with awe, saying, "We have seen extraordinary things today."

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Do you see the contrast between what life was demanding of Jesus and how He responded? Once again, we don't know the words Jesus prayed in the desolate place, but we do see the amazing fruit of those prayers.

# PART 1 | LEARNING TO PRAY ALONE

Jesus said, "Do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' Your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." Matthew 6v31-33 ESV

Notice: Jesus saw prayer as a remedy for worry and anxiety.

# PREPARE.

GET AWAY WITH GOD.

Return to your favorite quiet place.

- 1. Don't miss this part.
- 2. Slow down.
- 3. Breathe in.
- 4. Breathe out.
- 5. Raise your expectations.

# FOCUS YOUR MIND.

Activate your faith and trust in the goodness of God by opening yourself to what He has for you today. Pray **Psalm 139v23-24** (Or simply begin with your private prayer language.).

"Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."

# LEARN.

Watch Jesus talk about prayer and anxiety in Matthew 6v25-34:

Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on.

Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?

Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them.

Are you not of more value than they?

And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.

But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith?

Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all.

But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.

We see into the mind of Jesus about everyday worries and anxieties. Did you follow the logic? Don't do this because of that. Instead do this because of that.

# PRAY.

Like a jiu-jitsu master, Jesus taught His disciples to absorb the blow of their opponents (worry and anxiety) only to turn it back against them. By simply taking our worries to the Father daily, irrational fears, legitimate worries, and common anxieties lose their power.

How did God respond to Jesus in prayer? He called Jesus His "beloved Son". Author Henri Nouwen writes,
"Success, popularity and power can indeed present a great temptation, but their seductive quality often comes from the way they are part of a much larger temptation of self-rejection. Self-rejection is the greatest enemy of the spiritual life because it contradicts the sacred voice that calls us the beloved."
How did Jesus defeat temptation? By believing the voice that called Him "beloved" and rejecting all other labels. What labels have contradictory voices tried to give you? Write them down. Cross them out. Then write the truth: "I am my Father's beloved child".

Have a conversation with God about the gap between what He says about you and how you feel about yourself.

Talk about the relationships that most shape your view of yourself and Him. Talk about what those relationships represent to you.

What father among you, if his son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent; or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion?

If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!

# REFLECT. What do you observe about how Jesus sees a good father-child relationship? What does this tell you about the way Jesus wants us to approach God in prayer? What's our posture? Keep going back to your new sacred space.

- 1. Grab a pillow.
- 2. Put it on the floor.
- Get on your knees.
- 4. Inhale.
- 5. Exhale.

#### FOCUS YOUR MIND.

Pray this prayer of surrender from Jesus' mother, Mary, found in Luke 1v38. (Or use your private prayer language for a few moments.)

"Behold, the handmaiden of the Lord. Let it be to me according to your word."

#### LEARN.

Watch what Jesus says about allegiance to God's kingdom in Matthew 25v31-46:

When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, then He will sit on His glorious throne.

Before Him will be gathered all the nations, and He will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats.

And He will place the sheep on his right, but the goats on the left.

Then the King will say to those on His right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.'

Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you?

And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'

These are sobering words. How does Jesus say we bow to the King? What do you make of the nature of God's kingdom here? How does this King say we pledge our allegiance to Him? What relationships does He seem to say are the sites for His future rule to apply to our present lives? What does He not say about His kingdom that you may have previously thought?	
PRAY.	
We live in the now and not-yet of Jesus' kingdom. When we pray "your kingdom come" we're asking for two things:	
1. The future return of Jesus reign in righteousness and justice	
2. Here-and-now opportunities for you to bring that goodness to the weak and vulnerable	
What might #2 look like in your life today?	

#### **NOW START PRAYING!**

Are you still bowing? Declare your allegiance to Jesus as your one and only King. Pray for Him to return quickly!

Ask for eyes to see opportunities to love and give and serve like Jesus.

NOW STOP.

## LISTEN.

Now create some space to listen to what God might be telling you. Start with this prayer from **Psalm 86v11:**

(Or use your private prayer language for a few moments.)

"Bless the LORD, O my soul, And forget not all His benefits You satisfy my mouth with good things, So that my youth is renewed like the eagle's."

#### LEARN.

Watch Jesus' posture toward God's abundance in Luke 9v12-17

Now the day began to wear away, and the twelve came and said to Jesus, "Send the crowd away to go into the surrounding villages and countryside to find lodging and get provisions, for we are here in a desolate place."

But Jesus said to them, "You give them something to eat."

They said, "We have no more than five loaves and two fish—unless we are to go and buy food for all these people."

For there were about five thousand men.

And Jesus said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty each." And they did so, and had them all sit down.

And taking the five loaves and the two fish, Jesus looked up to heaven and (prayed) a blessing over them.

Then He broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd.

And they all ate and were satisfied. And what was left over was picked up, twelve baskets of broken pieces.

In your own words, interpret what happened in this story in 2-3 sentences.
PRAY.

An equally valid translation of "give us each day our daily bread" is "give us our bread for tomorrow." When the disciples brought their immediate need to Jesus He converted their "not enough" to fully satisfy their daily need with His "more than enough" provision.

#### PREPARE.

GET AWAY WITH GOD.

Find your spot.

- 1. Quiet distractions.
- 2. Feel peaceful.
- 3. Take a beat.
- 4. Feel your breath.
- 5. Notice your heartbeat.

#### FOCUS YOUR MIND.

Start by saying this personalized version of Psalm 103v8-12 as a reminder of God's mercy:

My God is merciful and gracious to me, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

He has not dealt with me according to my sins, nor punished me according to my iniquities.

As high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is His steadfast love toward those who fear Him

As far as the east is from the west, so far does He remove my transgressions from me.

#### LEARN.

Watch how Jesus talks about asking for forgiveness in prayer Luke 18v9-14: Jesus told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt:

Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.

The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus:

'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.'

But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying,

'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!'

I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.

REFLECT.
To whom did Jesus teach this parable? Was Jesus was trying to shame them or help them?
Write out the meaning of this parable in your own words.
PRAY.
Jesus teaches us to humble ourselves before God, confess our sin, and ask for forgiveness.
James, the brother of Jesus, reminds us, "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." (James 4v6)
Jot down a discrete word or two (or three) that represents things you need to confess to God:

#### **NOW START PRAYING!**

Start with the tax collector's humble prayer: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" Confess anything you need to confess. Don't hold back. He already knows. Thank God for hearing your prayer. Say aloud: "I am forgiven."

Watch how Jesus talks about our forgiveness of others in Matthew 18v21-35:

Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?" Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times.

"Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts. As he began the settlement, a man who owed him 10,000 bags of gold was brought to him. Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt. At this the servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.'The servant's master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go. They said, "We have no more than five loaves and two fish—unless we are to go and buy food for all these people."

"But when he went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him 100 silver coins. He grabbed him and began to choke him! 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded.

"His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay it back.' "But he refused. Instead, he had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt.

When the other servants saw what had happened, they were outraged and went and told their master everything that had happened.

"Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I canceled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?'

In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed. This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart."

Read that last sentence again. Do you think Jesus really is that serious about our

## FOCUS YOUR MIND.

Pray this prayer of direction from Psalm 23v3.

"Lead me in paths of righteousness for Your name's sake."

## LEARN.

Watch how Jesus talked to His disciples about temptation and escape in **Luke 21-22:** 

Jesus said, "Watch yourselves lest your hearts be weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and cares of this life, and that day come upon you suddenly like a trap.

For it will come upon all who dwell on the face of the whole earth. But stay awake at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are going to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."

Later, a dispute also arose among them, as to which of them was to be regarded as the greatest. Jesus said, "Simon, Simon, behold, Satan demanded to have you, that he might sift you like wheat, but I have prayed for you that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned again, strengthen your brothers."

Peter said to him, "Lord, I am ready to go with you both to prison and to death."

Jesus said, "I tell you, Peter, the rooster will not crow this day, until you deny three times that you know me."

What three things did Jesus say to guard our hearts against here? What do those things have to do with the larger theme of temptation? What temptation did Simon face? What did Jesus pray?
PRAY.
Jesus warned against common temptations like unbridled indulgence ("dissipation"), overconsumption ("drunkenness"), and everyday comforts ("cares of this world"), because those things make us weak and susceptible to the ultimate temptation — denying Jesus.
What kinds of indulgences, overconsumption, and everyday comforts are you most prone to?

#### **NOW START PRAYING!**

Remind yourself God is an abundant giver, not a stingy taker.

Open up to God about some of the little things you like a lot your go to comforts.

Asks God to lead you down paths of escape from common temptations.

NOW STOP.

## LISTEN.

Proverbs 22v3 savs "A prudent man sees danger and hides, but the simple pass

Ask God to show you any relationships to avoid or simple habits to give up.
Record your thoughts here:
KEEP ASKING.
Jesus said, in <b>Matthew 5v30,</b> "If your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body go into hell."
*Disclaimer: Jesus is not talking about self mutilation or cutting yourself in this verse.
Most of you aren't here, but if you're over your head with a particular addiction or sin, Jesus says it will require something drastic! If this is you, ask God for His grace and power to take this step. Write down and do whatever He says.

Read the story of how God heard Jesus' prayers in John 11:

Now a man named Lazarus was sick. He was from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. So the sisters sent word to Jesus, "Lord, the one you love is sick."

When he heard this, Jesus said, "This sickness will not end in death. No, it is for God's glory so that God's Son may be glorified through it."

His disciples replied, "Lord, if he sleeps, he will get better." Jesus had been speaking of his death, but his disciples thought He meant natural sleep. So then He told them plainly, "Lazarus is dead, and for your sake I am glad I was not there, so that you may believe. But let us go to him."

When Jesus saw Mary weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, He was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. "Where have you laid him?" He asked. "Come and see, Lord," they replied.

Then Jesus said, "Did I not tell you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said,

He had honored God by taking His feelings to Him and God heard Him. Are there people or places you tend to take your deepest frustrations to instead of God? Name them.

#### **NOW START PRAYING!**

Process your frustrations and fears with God. Ask God for help!

Call out to God on behalf of someone you know who is deeply hurting.

Thank God that He heard you!

NOW STOP.

# LISTEN.

<b>1 Peter 5v7</b> says when we cast our cares upon Him, He moves in close and cares for us. Invite God to take care of your situation. Listen to what He says.
Record your thoughts here:
KEEP ASKING.
<b>1 John 5v14-15</b> says, "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of Him."

"Even when I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for You are with me;."

#### LEARN.

#### Read Mark 4v35-41.

On that day, when evening had come, Jesus said to them, "Let us go across to the other side."

And leaving the crowd, they took Him with them in the boat, just as he was. And other boats were with Him.

And a great windstorm arose, and the waves were breaking into the boat, so that the boat was already filling.

But Jesus was in the stern, asleep on the cushion. And they woke Him and said to Him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?"

And Jesus awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea:

<sup>&</sup>quot;Peace! Be still!"

And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. He said to them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obev him?" REFLECT. What did you notice about Jesus in this story? How do you think He was able to pray with such a sense of calmness and with such power? PRAY. Jesus only did what He saw the Father do. So He didn't have to panic in the story. He prayed with very few words and with authority. How? He had already spent enough time with God to know His plan — "We're going to the other side." If you pray before the storms come, you'll pray calm prayers under pressure too.

#### **NOW START PRAYING!**

Spend some time praying about what's ahead.

Talk to God about your plans with an open mind.

(Another perfect time to pray in the Spirit for a little while.)

NOW STOP.

## LISTEN.

Open yourself to the voice of God with the prayer of young Samuel (1 Samuel 3v10):

"Speak. For your servant is listening."
Record your thoughts here:
KEEP ASKING.
Ask God to give you a spirit of might in your inner person. Ask for boldness. Ask for clear direction and revelation of what to expect in the coming weeks and months.

He went down (from the mountain) with them and stood on a level place.

A large crowd of his disciples was there and a great number of people from all over Judea, from Jerusalem, and from the coastal region around Tyre and Sidon, who had come to hear Him and to be healed of their diseases.

Those troubled by impure spirits were cured, and the people all tried to touch Him, because power was coming from Him and healing them all.

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We don't know the words of Jesus' all night prayer, but what immediately followed? What might this suggest about how important it was to Jesus to be around the right people? What do you observe happened as a result of His prayers and His relationship choices?

I tell you, love your enemies. Help and give without expecting a return. You'll never—I promise—regret it.

Live out this God-created identity the way our Father lives toward us, generously and graciously, even when we're at our worst.

Our Father is kind; you be kind.

All this I have spoken while still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

"In the same way, the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us!

REFLECT.

Our hope is that these 21 days mark the beginning or the next major step in your journey with prayer.

Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

\*For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever, Amen. From Matthew 6v9-13 ESV

# THE SHEMA

Jesus likely would have prayed this famous prayer morning, noon, and night all His life.

Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.

Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads.

Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.

So if you faithfully obey the commands I am giving you today—to love the Lord your God and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul—then I will send rain on your land in its season, both autumn and spring rains, so that you may gather in your grain, new wine and olive oil. I will provide grass in the fields for your cattle, and you will eat and be satisfied.

Be careful, or you will be enticed to turn away and worship other gods and bow down to them. Then the Lord's anger will burn against you, and he will shut up the heavens so that it will not rain and the ground will yield no produce, and you will soon perish from the good land the Lord is giving you.

Fix these words of mine in your hearts and minds; tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Teach them to your children, talking about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.-

Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates, so that your days and the days of your children may be many in the land the Lord swore to give your ancestors, as many as the days that the heavens are above the earth.

Berakhot are prayers of blessing that were a part of worship gatherings during Jesus day.

While some of the nuances adapted over the years, Jesus would have prayed a version of these prayers.

#### **MORNING**

#### [When you first wake up and open your eyes]

"Blessed is He who gives sight to the blind."

#### [When you get out of bed]

"Blessed is He who sets the captives free."

#### [When you get dressed]

"Blessed is He who clothes the naked."

#### [When you put on your shoes]

"Blessed is He who provides for all my needs."

#### THROUGHOUT YOUR DAY

# [When you eat a meal where bread is at the table, you hold up the bread and say...]

"Blessed is He who brings forth bread from the earth."

#### [When you eat a meal where wine is at the table]

"Blessed is He, Creator of the fruit of the vine."

## [When you eat a meal any other types of foods]

"Blessed is He through whose word all things come"

#### [When you see the first budding tree in springtime]

"Blessed is He who did not omit anything from the world, And created it with good creations and good trees for people to enjoy."

# [When you see lightning, falling stars, mountains, great deserts, or the sky in its beauty]

"Blessed is He who made the creation."

#### [When you hear thunder or feel an earthquake]

"Blessed is He whose strength and power fill the world."

#### [When you see a beautiful person, animal, or tree]

"Blessed is He who has such as these in the world."

#### ON CERTAIN OCCASIONS

#### [When you see a friend after a year's separation]

"Blessed is He who revives the dead."

#### [When it rains or something else good happens]

"Blessed is He who is good and gives good things."

#### [When something terrible happens]

"Blessed is He who is the one true judge."

#### [When you are saved from an accident or serious illness]

"Blessed is He who does good to the undeserving and has rendered every kindness to me."

#### [When you encounter a place where God has done a miracle]

"Blessed is He who has done miracles in this place."

#### [When you reach a highly anticipated happy occasion]

"Blessed is He who has given us life, and preserved us, and brought us to this season."
